2. Rules

2.1 The Regatta will be governed by the “Rules” as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012(RSS).

2.2 RSS Appendix P will apply.

2.3 For OP Class, RSS 61.1(a) “(2) if the length of the boat is shorter than 6m, red flag is unnecessary” will be deleted.

2.4 If there is a conflict between Cass Rules and Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions will take precedence. This alters Rule 63.7.

3. Advertising

Event sponsor advertisements are considered, and if requested, competitors are to display the advertisements on their boats.

5. Eligibility

5.1 Member of Japan Sailing Federation (2008) (Excluding foreign sailors)

5.2 « 470, RS:X »

Japanese 470 and RS:X class competitors shall be relevant class association. Competitors need recommendation from JSAF, relevant association, or Prefecture's federation.

« Snipe »

Competitors shall be under the age of 22 years on 31 December 2009, and a financial member of JSAF (2009) and of Snipe Federation (2009).

5.3 5.1 and 5.2 applies only to Japanese nationality person.

6. Entries

Entries shall be made on the form provided with this NOR, and must be received by the organizer described below by 31 January, 2009 by post, e-mail or FSX.
Support boats will need to register at the regatta office upon arrival.

9. Measurements

- 9.1 The measurement certificate for each boat must be shown at the registration. (except OP Class)
- 9.2 All sails shall be completed 1st measurement by the official measure before the event.
- 9.3 Spot inspection may take place both at sea and on shore.

10. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

11. Venue

JSAF Wakayama International Regatta will be held on Wakayama Marina City "National Training Center (Wakayama Sailing Center)" and Wakaura Bay

12. Courses

All courses will be either Trapezoidal Course or Sausage Course.

13. Scoring System

- 13.1 The low point Scoring System of RSS Appendix A will be used.
Snipe Class will use Snipe Class low point scoring system under Snipe Class Rule.
- 13.2 12 races are scheduled for 470 class, and 5 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
9 races are scheduled for both RS:X and Snipe classes, of which 5 races for the RS:X and 3 races for the Snipe Classes are required to be completed to constitute series.
7 races are scheduled for OP class, and 1 race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 13.3 When more than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. Safety

- 14.1 Adequate personal floating devices (e.g. life jacket) are necessary to be worn at sea. Wet-suits nor Dry-suits are inadequate. If the floating device is inflatable, it must be inflated and worn at sea. This changes the preamble to Part 4 and Rule 40.
- 14.2 For OP Class, in addition to the Class Rules 4.2(a), 4.2(b), 4.3(a), 4.3(b) and 3.3.4, each boat must carry a paddle with blade larger than 0.025 m². Each competitor shall carry a whistle attached to their safety jacket by line. Any competitor breaking this rule will be penalized by adding 5 points to each race. Without a hearing this changes Rule A5 and Rule 63.1.

15. Support Boat

- 15.1 Support Boats may be required to act as rescue boats if called upon and may be permitted to use under the following condition.
 - a) Support boats shall need to register, and receive permission. Support boats with permission are allowed to carry half numbers of boat registration crew members on board.
 - b) Support boats shall stay outside the race area when racing. Upon Race Committee's request, support boats may enter the race area and act as rescue boats.
 - c) Support boats must register upon arrival, and must pay the Harbor fee individually.
 - d) Each support boat shall be insured with Yacht Motor Boat Insurance(valid third party liability and crew accident)
- 15.2 If not complying to the Race Committee, no permission will be given.
- 15.3 When rescue is required, "Pink Flag" will be displayed on the Race Committee boat.

16. Prizes

- 16-1 Medals or other prizes will be awarded according to the number of entries for each class.

- 16-2 In this championship, Selection will be made as followings.
1. Selection of 2009 National Teams for 470 class & RS:X class
For both men and women participating to 470 class and RS:X class, Japanese members will be selected from the higher ranking competitors.
Men's 470 Class: 3 Boats 6 Men
Women's 470 Class: 3 Boats 6 Women
Men's RS:X Class: 3 Boats 3 Men
Women's RS:X: 3 Boats 3 Women
2. Selection of for RS:X class World Championship
Higher ranked competitor will be selected to the 2009 World Championship
If declined, the next higher ranked competitor will be selected, and so on.
3. Selection of 470 Class Junior World Championship
Under 22 years old (born after 1 January 1988) Japanese competitors in 470 Class, the top two Men's boat and top Women's boat will be selected to the Junior World Championship.
4. Selection of Snipe Class Junior World Championship
The top 2 Helmsman will be selected to the 2009 World Junior Snipe Championship (August 2009, San Diego, U.S.A)
17. Liability and Insurance
- 17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS4, Decision to Race.
- 17.2 The organizing authority, or any person involved in this organization will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death.
- 17.3 470 class and RS:X: boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance. 470 and RS:X must bring their insurance policy at registration.
18. General
This Regatta will intend Doping Inspection.
English will be the official language for 470 and RS:X classes.
Japanese will be the official language for OP and Snipe classes.

If anyone is available for the race committee volunteer, please contact the head office.


A4. Accommodation
